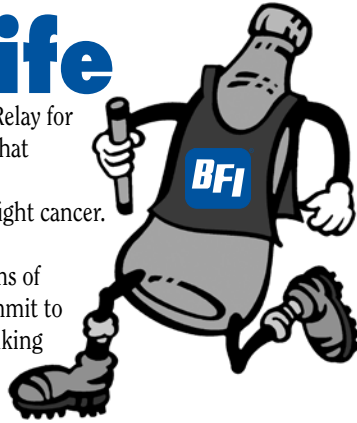

YOU CAN RECYCLE:

- **Newspapers, Cardboard and ALL Mixed Paper** Including file folders, hard bound books, spiral notebooks, hanging file folders, candy wrappers and telephone books.
- **Cardboard** Broken down or cutup cardboard so it will fit inside the cart. Examples are cardboard egg cartons, cereal, toothpaste, gift and shoeboxes.
- **Glass and Aluminum Beverage Containers**
- **Milk and Juice Containers**
- **Rigid Plastics** Examples are shrink-wrap, take home dinner plastic trays, ketchup, shampoo, bleach bottles, CD cases, plastic film/transparencies, grocery bags (bag in a bag).
- **Steel/Tin Cans**

NO

YOU CAN'T RECYCLE:

- **No Contaminated Paper** Examples are pizza boxes, used paper plates, wax paper, foil/mylar gift-wrap.
- **No paper soiled by pets or bathroom waste**
- **No Styrofoam** Regardless if there is a triangle or number underneath the carton.
- **No Clothing or Textiles**
- **No Ceramics or Commercial Glass**
- **No Hazardous, Electronic or Medical Waste** May be taken to Household Hazardous Waste Facility-139 Sun Street, 831-424-5520.
- **No Construction or Demolition Material**
- **No Waxed or Coated Cardboard Boxes**
- **No Diapers, Carpet, Tires**
